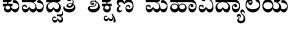

Best Practices – 1

1. Title of the Practice: REMEDIAL CLASSES

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- a) To encourage slow learner student teachers to become academically competent.
- b) To bridge the gap and enable them to cope up the current syllabus.
- c) To prepare students competent enough to prepare for various competitive examinations.
- d) To promote students for higher education after completion of B.Ed.

3. The Context:

- a) Most of the students enrolled are from rural background but with high ambitions of becoming teacher.
- b) The overall performance of the qualifying examinations motivated the Institution to encourage slow learners.
- c) Students are isolated due to socio economic background.
- d) To enable students to competent in gaining placement.

4. The Practice:

The Practice The learning level of the students are measured based on the overall performance of previous qualifying examinations. Based on the overall efficiency of the students in curricular, cocurricular and extra curricular activities of the students and percentage scored in the previous qualifying examinations segregate the list of students as slow learners. Further, during the post admission, the performance made in internal tests, semester end results, college prepares the list of slow learners. In a time table library periods and tutorial periods used for to conduct of Remedial Classes. Students are strictly advised to attend these remedial classes. We have adopted small group tutoring, one to one tutoring, peer tutoring as part of remedial classes. The remedial class has helped good number of slow learners to cope up the syllabus and enable them to write effective in semester end result. College has got good track record of semester end results on comparison with B.Ed. colleges affiliated to Kuvempu University.

5. Impact of the Practice:

On the faculty members

- a) The remedial programme saw a gradual increase in learning abilities at the end of the programme, its reflection result of the teacher's efforts.
- b) To reduce levels of wastage and stagnation.

On the Students

- a) Provides reinforcement for struggled students.
- b) Provides small group and one to one support.
- c) Provides basic skills training.

Evidence of Success -

- a) This initiation has helped good number students in coping of the course curriculum and also the efforts made by respective teachers have reflected in semester end result.
- b) To reduce levels of wastage and stagnation.
- c) Students who have attended remedial classes have increased their marks in semester end result conducted by University.
- d) This programme has motivated slow learners and also faculty members to render their holistic efforts in bringing slow learners to competent learners.

6. Problems Encountered:

a) Slow learners are hesitant to attend Remedial Classes but students who all attended the remedial classes got sufficient knowledge and encouragement to study scientifically.

Best Practice - 02.

1. Title of the Practice: Work Based Education (SOCIALLY USEFUL PRODUCTIVE WORK)

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- a) Familiarize with the different productive activities in his community.
- b) Understand the scientific principles involved in various forms of work.
- c) To acquire knowledge of sources of raw materials and different tools and equipment used in the production of goods and services.
- d) Understand utility of Productive work and services to community.
- e) Understand the process of planning and organization of productive work.
- f) Develop an awareness of social problems.
- g) Develops an understanding to solve the problems and come up with new ideas and innovations.

3. The Context:

The National Education Commission also known as Kothari Commission (1964-66) pointed out that there should be Work Experience followed by vocationalization of education in the school system. It was stated that the curriculum of school education should be directly linked with the productivity so as to contribute to our National Development. So it was proposed to implement the concept of work experience in Indian schools. It also conceived by our leaders during the national movement for freedom and as propounded-by Mahatama Gandhi has its genesis in work-based education. He was of the opinion that if education is based on socially useful productive work, it would be an instrument for personality development and social transformation.

The Review committee also known as Ishwarbhai Patel committee was appointed in 1977 to examine ten year school system, in which the committee recommended the term "socially useful productive work" (SUPW) to work experience (WE) and recommended that SUPW to be an integral part of curriculum at all stages of school education. In the light of recommendations of committee SUPW was introduced at the school level in different states and Union Territories. It has been introduced and implemented under different names, such as Craft education (1937), work Experience (1967) and then socially useful productive work (1977).

4. The Practice:

- College has facilitated SUPW practices every Saturday in a week.
- College provides SUPW materilas for productive works and some low cost productive works student teachers were informed to bring needful materials from home.
- In each classes college introduces a resource persons and if student teachers have such skills they were also performed as resource person of the class.
- The active participation and involvement of each student in this class were assessed by the mentor teacher and grades were given at the end of the course.

5. Impact of the Practice:

On the faculty members

- There should be provision for a teacher to beskilled personnel for different activities.
- It helps to understand the student's creativness and lateral thinking.

On the Students:

- Acquaints the children with work and services prevailing in the community.
- Develop sense of respect to manual workers.
- Develop a desire to work and contribute to the society.
- Inculcate positive attitudes of team work.
- Development of values like tolerance, cooperation and helpfulness.
- Belief in dignity of labour and self reliance.
- Helps in understanding the principles involved in various forms of work.
